Regimen Reference Order - GYNE - gemcitabine + DOCEtaxel (MET)

ARIA: GYNE - [gemcitabine + DOCEtaxel (MET)]

Planned Course: Every 21 days until disease progression or unacceptable toxicity

Indication for Use: Uterine Leiomyosarcoma Metastatic

CVAD: At Provider's Discretion

Proceed with treatment if:

Cycle 1

• ANC equal to or greater than 1.5 x $10^9/L$ AND Platelets equal to or greater than $100 \times 10^9/L$

Cycle 2 and onwards

- ANC equal to or greater than 1.2 x $10^9/L$ AND Platelets equal to or greater than 75 x $10^9/L$
 - Contact Physician if parameters not met

gemcitabine	900 mg/m ²	IV in normal saline 250 mL over 90 minutes			

DOCEtaxel	100 mg/m ²	IV in normal saline 250 mL over 1 hour, following the administration rates below: • Administer at 100 mL/hour for 15 minutes, then • Administer remaining volume over 45 minutes Use non-DEHP bags and non-DEHP administration sets OR For 500 mL bags (when Pharmacy must prepare DOCEtaxel in 500 mL normal saline for concentration-dependent stability): IV in normal saline 500 mL over 1 hour, following the administration rates below: • Administer at 200 mL/hour for 15 minutes, then • Administer remaining volume over 45 minutes Use non-DEHP bags and non-DEHP administration sets
normal saline	100 mL	ONLY for patients with a PORT IV over 12 minutes *Nursing Alert: This volume is to be administered after standard flush

REQUIRED MONITORING

All Cycles

Days 1 and 8

• CBC, serum creatinine and liver enzymes as per Physician Orders

Day 8 Only

- Full vital signs (temperature, heart rate, respiratory rate, blood pressure and O₂ saturation) at baseline and as clinically indicated
- No observation period is required after DOCEtaxel administration. Patient can be discharged from treatment room if stable whether they had a reaction or not

Recommended Support Medications

metoclopramide	10 – 20 mg	Orally every 4 hours as needed for nausea and vomiting		

DISCHARGE INSTRUCTIONS

- Patients should be instructed to contact their cancer team immediately if symptoms of hypersensitivity reactions occur after discharge
- Instruct patient to continue taking anti-emetic(s) at home
- Reinforce applicable safe handling precautions of medications, blood and body fluids for 48 hours after completion of chemotherapy
