Chemotherapy

Your doctor has told you that you need chemotherapy. You may be worried about how the chemo will make you feel. You are not alone. Many people worry about this.

People experience the side effects from chemotherapy differently. Here are some tips to help you manage your side effects:

- Take your medications as prescribed.
- Make a list of any questions you have and write down how you felt after your treatment.
- Talk with your nurse or doctor about how you felt and ask your questions. They can make changes for the next treatment to make it better.

What is chemotherapy?

Chemotherapy is also called chemo. It is medicine used to treat cancer. Chemotherapy may be given alone. It can also help treatments like surgery or radiation work better.

Baahpakaan Otishi-nisitawendaanaawaa mayakishkaakewinan awiyak kaa-miinitwaa mashkihkini kihci-aahkosiiwinik. Oneniwan kaa-niibidesinahikaatekin ke-ishi-naakatawaapatamanin:

- Maamayaam ishi-odaapinanin kimashkihkiiman kaa-ishi-onatamaakooyan.
- Niipidesinahanin kakwetwewinan miina masinahanin aaniin kaainamacihoyan kaa-ishkwaa-natawihikooyan.
- Ayamihi mashkihkiiwihkwe naanta mashkihkiiwinini aaniin kaa-inamacihoyan ekwa tahsh kakwetwen. Okakiimaamiinwadoonaawaa kinatawihikoowin ahpii miina natawihikwaa.

Kekonen ihiwe chemotherapy kaa-ishinihkaatek?

Chemotherapy kaa-ishinihkaatek kaye ishinhkaate chemo. Mashkihki ihiwe kaa-inshinihkaate kaa-aapatak kihci-aahkosiiwinik. Mashkihki takii-beshikoo-aapatan. Natawihiwewinik kaye takii-ishi-aapatan taapishkooc maacishiwewinik naanta kaye cahkkaasikewinik.



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How does chemotherapy work?

Chemotherapy can:

- stop cells from growing and dividing
- stop cancer cells from travelling to other areas of the body
- slow the growth of cancer cells
- shrink cancer before surgery

Chemotherapy works on the whole body so healthy cells can be affected too. This is why you may have side effects. Healthy cells will repair themselves with time.

Side Effects of Chemotherapy may include:

nausea and vomiting * mouth sores * appetite changes * fatigue * hair loss fertility issues infection diarrhea * constipation *

Remember: You may or may not get some of the side effects from chemotherapy.

Mashkihki kaa-aapatak Kihci-aahkosiiwinik

Aaniin tahsh enanohkiimakak mashkihki?

Mashkihki takii-:

- kipitinikemakan kaa-oci-nitaawikik miina kaa-oci-bahpakeyimakak
- kipitinikan kaa-oci-oshohomakak kihci-aahkosiwin ekaa baahpahkaan ci-ishaamakak miyawik
- ci-niikinikemakak ekaa ci-misdeyimakak kihci-aahkosiwin
- ci-acoonikemakak kihci-aahkowiwinik mwaye-maacishowaniwak

Mashkihki ihiwe kaa-aapatak misiwe piko ishi-anohkiimakan miyawik. Amihiwe kaa-oci-mayakishkaakoyan. Mino-ayaawishkaakewinan tawaweshihitisoomakanoon.

Kaa-ishi-mayakishkaakemakak Mashkihki:

nedwamacihowin kaye baahpakomowin * omiikiiwihsewin midoonik * wiihsiniwin kaa-maamiishkicihsek* caakiiwamacihowin * pashkoshtikwaanehsewin awashihshhiikewin ishihsewinan miniiwihsewin kishiwashkadewin* kibwahakaciiwin *

* kaa-kihkinawaatasinahikaatekin ineniwan takwanoon inwetamaakewinik

Ishi-kihkendaman: Amihiwe ke-ishi-kihkendaman ci-mayakishkaakoyan mashkihki naanta kaye iitok ekaa cimayakishkaakoyan.



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How is chemotherapy given?

Chemo is most often given by a needle into a vein (IV or intravenous). When the chemo treatment is finished the needle is removed. Sometimes a thin tube is inserted into a vein and is left in for all your treatments. This is called a PICC or PORT. Chemo is also given by:

- mouth (pill or liquid)
- needle into a muscle (injection)
- rubbing onto the skin (cream)

How often will I get chemotherapy?

Chemo treatments are often called cycles. The number of treatments or cycles given depends on each person's cancer. Treatments may be given:

- daily, weekly or monthly
- continuously by a pump that you wear home

Mashkihki kaa-aapatak Kihci-aahkosiiwinik

Aaniin endoocikaatek Kaa-aapatak Mashkihki?

Ciishtawhaakanoo wawiya omiskweyaabiik kaa-miinaakanooc mashkihkini eskam kaye akootamawaakanoo. Ekwa tahsh ahpii kaa-kiishicikaatek natawihiwewin kiicikonikaate shaaponikan. Eshkam pimaashikawinikan pitinikaate miskweyaabiik ekwa amihi enakokacikaatek inikok ke-pimi-natawihikooyan. Amihiwe ishinihkaatek PICC nanta PORT. Ekwa kaye ihimaa oci-pakitinikaate:

- misiwepancikewin
- ciishtahikewin
- shishoonikewin

Aayaanahpii ke-aapacitamoonikooyaan mashkihki?

Amihiwe kaye eshinihkaatek (cycles). Nanaaka piko tashwaa natawihiwaaniwan aaniin iko kaa-ishi-baahbeshikowaac awiyak kaa-kihci-aahkosiwaac. Kaa-ishi-pakitinikaatekin Natawihiwewinan:

- kaa-kiishikaak, kaa-pimikonakaak naanta mekwaac kaapimakisoc piihsim
- nashine piko ihiwe kaa-kikishkmoohikooyan kaa-ishi-taayan



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How long does chemo take to give?

Chemo treatments can take a few minutes, several hours or a few days.

Where will I get chemotherapy?

Chemo is usually given in the cancer clinic and you go home the same day. Some treatments are only given in a hospital and you need to stay overnight or longer.
